

## University of Miami inducts newest Hall of Fame members

**Inducted into the UM Sports  
Hall of Fame**



Reggie Wayne was inducted into the University of Miami's Hall of Fame on Thursday, March 24, 2011. Reggie, a 2-time All State Honoree, out of John Ehret High School in New Orleans, Louisiana made an immediate impact on UM's offense and showed the talent that propelled him into the school's record books.

As a freshman in 1997, he was named BIG EAST Rookie of the Year and Sporting News Freshman All America. Reggie's 48 receptions as a true freshman surpassed Michael Irvin's previously record of 46.

In his senior year, Reggie led Miami to an 11-1 record, leading the team with 755 receiving yards, 43 receptions, 10 touchdowns, while averaging 17.6 yards per catch. His 10 touchdowns tied him for 2<sup>nd</sup> most all time behind Irvin's record of 11. As a four year starter, he set a school record of 173 career catches (including 36 consecutive games with a reception.) and is one of 3 wide receivers in school history to post 20 or more touchdowns in his career joining Michael Irvin and Lamar Thomas. He finished his career at UM with 173 receptions, (school record) 2,510 yards, 20 touchdown, and a Sugar Bowl victory his senior year against University of Florida in his hometown.

Reggie Wayne was the first round pick by the Indianapolis Colts in the 2001 NFL draft, where he has continued to impress. In his 10th season with the Colts, he has amassed 787 receptions, 10,748 yards and 68 touchdowns, earning him 5 Pro Bowl selections; 3 All-Pro selections and of course a SUPER BOWL.

Reggie graduated from Miami with a Bachelor of Liberal Arts (BLA '01) degree and is the son of Ralph and Denise Wayne.

Other inductees were Ivan Duvenhage (Women's Tennis Coach), Bobby Hill (Baseball), Daphne Jongejans-Bousquet (Diving), Yolanda McCray (Track), Tyce Routson (Diving) and teammates Dan Morgan (Football), and Santana Moss (Football).
